In the early 1800's, after a devastating journey from Georgia over the Trail of Tears, the Cherokee Indians came to this area and built a nation. One of the most famous members of the Cherokee tribe was Sequoyah, who made many important contributions to his people. He is best known for inventing the Cherokee alphabet.

Cherokee Landing State Park, which lies in the heart of Cherokee Territory, is rich in history and beauty. This 146-acre park sits on the north shores of Lake Tenkiller and is surrounded by water and thick pine forests of the Cookson Hills. Known for black bass, white bass and crappie, Lake Tenkiller attracts many fishing enthusiasts. An abundance of wildlife including white-tailed deer, raccoons, squirrels and many species of song birds can be viewed at Cherokee Landing.

Cherokee Landing State Park is located 10 miles south of the city of Tahlequah on Hwy. 82.

STATE PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS TO REMEMBER

- Please do not litter.
- Please be courteous to other park visitors; don't intrude on other camper's sites.
- Quiet hours are 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.
- All pets must be caged or on a leash not to exceed 10 feet.
- 14-day camping limit.
- All overnight camping is subject to fee.
- Park in designated areas only.
- Fires should be lit only in fire rings. Don't leave your fire unattended; extinguish it properly when leaving.
- Collecting firewood, nuts and berries, disturbing plants, and animals or other natural features is strictly prohibited.
- Please don't walk on, climb or otherwise mar any archaeological or cultural resource in the park. Abide by non-smoking postings to protect artifacts, natural resources and other park visitors.
- It is unlawful to dump water, sewage or effluent (grey water) from sinks, upon or into the surface of the ground or water. Don't wash food, clothing, dishes or other property at water hydrants or on the lakeshore.
- Glass containers prohibited in swimming areas.
- Curfew, 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., fishing, camping and boating only.
- Hunting is prohibited.
- Follow all fishing regulations.
- To ensure your safety, never hike or swim alone; have a first aid kit; observe all warning signs; stay alert to the weather; familiarize yourself with poisonous plants, insects and snakes.
- Pets MUST NOT be left unattended anywhere in the parks.**

ACCOMMODATIONS of Tenkiller State Park

CABINS

Tenkiller State Park has 38 cabins, nestled along the shores of Lake Tenkiller, awaiting your arrival. Cabins feature living areas with bedrooms, bathrooms, and kitchens with dishes, cookware & silverware. The cabins are a self-clean type during your stay with a daily linen exchange available. Enjoy the peace and quiet - cabins do not have telephones, but do have a TV. Call the Cabin Office at 918-489-5641 or reserve cabins on-line at travelok.com

GROUP FACILITIES

There is a community building, seating up to 100 people, which is available for rent. The building has central heat and air, but no kitchen facilities. There are 4 shelters that can be reserved at the Cabin Office.

Oklahoma's Tenkiller State Park, located near the dam of scenic Lake Tenkiller, offers vacationers a wonderful diversion of natural wonder and magnificent beauty.

Tenkiller Park is a recreation mecca. With some 1,190 acres in Oklahoma's Green Country, the park has facilities available for everything from hiking to scuba diving to boating and fishing. The scenery, especially around the wooded lake area, is breathtaking. The magnificent limestone cliffs that are found within the park have enchanted visitors from all around the world.

Lake Tenkiller is one of Oklahoma's most beautiful reservoirs. This 12,650 acre recreational paradise was formed in the 1950's with the construction of the Tenkiller Ferry Dam across the Illinois River (the dam is Oklahoma's second largest at 197 ft.)
