A trek through northwestern Oklahoma, once known as 'No Man's Land' for its ruggedly majestic terrain, delivers an itinerary chock-full of adventure. Pair estate wines with a serene stroll through beautifully landscaped grounds at Plymouth Valley Cellars. Sample live music on Sundays with a sweet Sooner Spirit red or Cowboy Blush at Indian Creek Village. Then, please your palate with flavorful pairings of fruit wines and delicious jams, cheeses, and buffalo sausage at Plain View. For extended adventures, Plymouth Valley and Indian Creek Village both offer overnight accommodations.

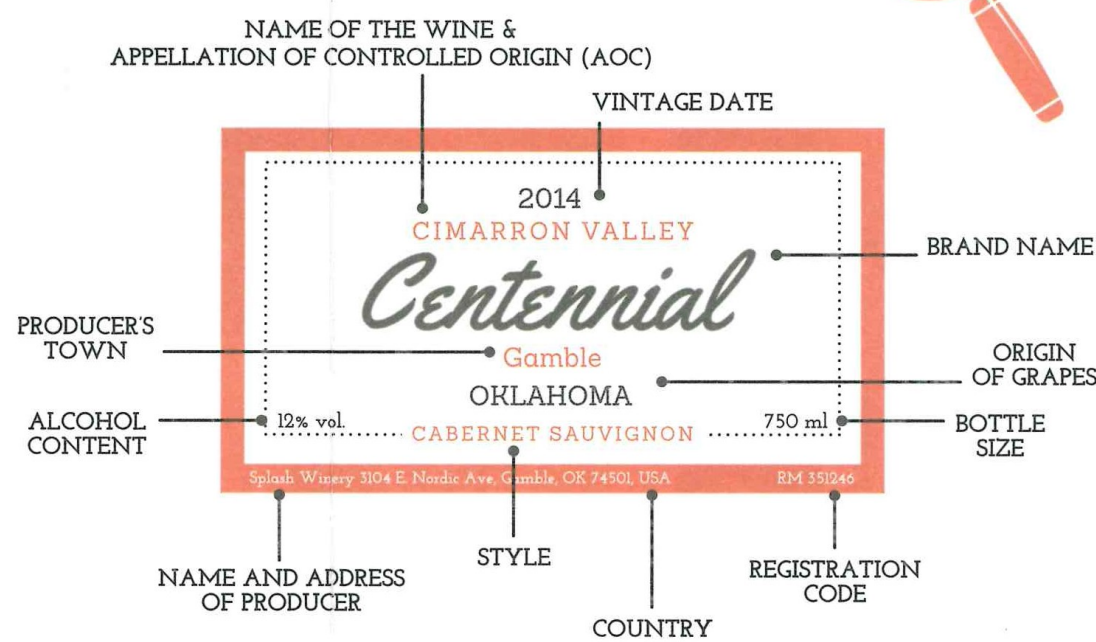

WINE HOW-TOS

How to Read a Wine Label



Appellation of Origin

another name for the area where the dominant grapes from the wine were grown. Stating the country, state, or county appellation on the wine label signifies that at least 75 percent of the grapes were grown in the named region.

75%



Vintage date

represents the year the grapes were harvested. When the vintage date is given, it must include an appellation of origin smaller than a country. If an American wine gives the state or county as their appellation of origin, 85 percent of the wine must have come from the specified year.

Estate bottled

signifies that 100 percent of the wine was grown from grapes in a viticultural area controlled or owned by the winery. The winery oversees the whole process from crushing the grapes, fermenting, finishing and aging the wine.

How to Speak Wine

Aroma - scent of the grapes.

Bouquet - total scent of the wine.

Lot - product of two or more wines combined.

Must - unfermented grape juice.

Nose - combined scent of bouquet and aroma together.

Treading - crushing grapes by foot.

Viticultural area - authorized grape-growing area based off certain geographical features, soil, elevation, climate, history, and other features.

White Wine & Champagne

Hold the glass/flute by its stem, and pinch the stem with your index finger and thumb. Holding it by the bowl can increase the wine's temperature.

How to Hold Your Wine Glass

Red Wine

Contrary to popular belief, hold red wine by the stem. This helps to not overheat the wine.
