

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CHEROKEE NATIONAL SUPREME COURT

The Cherokee National Supreme Court Museum, built in 1844, is the oldest government building still standing in Oklahoma. The museum houses the original printing press of the Cherokee Advocate, the official newspaper of the Cherokee Nation and the first newspaper in Oklahoma.

Enjoy three exhibit spaces, covering the history of the Cherokee National Judicial System, the Cherokee Advocate and Phoenix newspapers, and the Cherokee language.


